First REIT secures a S\$40 million term loan facility from HSBC

- *Funds will be used to finance its working capital and potential acquisitions with maturity spread over three to four years*
- *No short-term refinancing needs until 2017 and all debt will be on fixed-rate basis*

SINGAPORE – 10 October 2014 – Bowsprit Capital Corporation Limited (“Bowsprit”), as manager of **First Real Estate Investment Trust (“First REIT”** and as manager of First REIT, the **“Manager”**), today announced that it has secured a Term Loan Facility (“TLF”) from The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited (“HSBC” or **“The Bank”**) through its trustee, HSBC Institutional Trust Services (Singapore) Limited.

The TLF comprises two facility amounts of S\$20 million each, with maturity of three and four years from the date of the first drawdown of each facility amount, respectively. The TLF also provides First REIT with the option to hedge interest rates on a fixed-rate basis through an interest rate derivative facility.

The TLF will be secured by, amongst others, a first legal mortgage over Siloam Hospitals TB Simatupang.

First REIT will be using the TLF to finance its working capital and for potential acquisitions in the future. With this, First REIT will maintain its position of having no short-term refinancing needs until 2017 and all its debt will be on a fixed-rate basis.

Dr Ronnie Tan, Chief Executive Officer of Bowsprit Capital Corporation Limited, the Manager of First REIT said, “We are pleased to have successfully secured this term loan facility through the support of HSBC. First REIT has been prudent with our capital management and has managed to maintain our gearing below the regulatory 35% limit even with the latest acquisition of Siloam Hospitals Purwakarta.”

The TLF is subject to various conditions, including the satisfactory completion of legal documentation.

First Real Estate Investment Trust ("First REIT") is a real estate investment trust constituted by the Trust Deed entered into on 19 October 2006 between Bowsprit Capital Corporation Limited as the Manager and HSBC Institutional Trust Services (Singapore) Limited as the Trustee. First REIT was listed on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited on 11 December 2006.

First REIT is Singapore's first healthcare real estate investment trust that aims to invest in a diversified portfolio of income-producing real estate and / or real estate-related assets in Asia that are primarily used for healthcare and / or healthcare-related purposes.

Managed by Bowsprit Capital Corporation Limited, First REIT's portfolio consists of 15 properties located in Indonesia, Singapore and South Korea, namely 1) Siloam Hospitals Lippo Village, 2) Siloam Hospitals Kebon Jeruk, 3) Siloam Hospitals Surabaya, 4) Imperial Aryaduta Hotel & Country Club, 5) Mochtar Riady Comprehensive Cancer Centre, 6) Siloam Hospitals Lippo Cikarang, 7) Siloam Hospitals Manado & Hotel Aryaduta Manado, 8) Siloam Hospitals Makassar, 9) Siloam Hospitals Bali, 10) Siloam Hospitals TB Simatupang, 11) Siloam Hospitals Purwakarta 12) Pacific Healthcare Nursing Home @ Bukit Merah, 13) Pacific Healthcare Nursing Home II @ Bukit Panjang, 14) The Lentor Residence and 15) Sarang Hospital.

Its hospital assets in Indonesia are operated by PT Siloam International Hospitals Tbk, a subsidiary of PT Lippo Karawaci Tbk., a strong brand name in the Indonesian healthcare industry supported by a team of international healthcare professionals, whereas the Imperial Aryaduta Hotel & Country Club & Hotel Aryaduta Manado are operated by The Aryaduta Hotel & Resort Group. In Singapore, the nursing homes at Bukit Merah and Bukit Panjang are operated by Pacific Healthcare Nursing Home Pte. Ltd. and Pacific Eldercare and Nursing Pte. Ltd. respectively. The Lentor Residence is operated by First Lentor Residence Pte. Ltd. Sarang Hospital in South Korea is managed by a private doctor.

Through First REIT, investors can participate in an asset class that has a focus towards Asia's growing healthcare sector, which is boosted by an increase in life expectancy in Indonesia and the rest of Southeast Asia.
